REPORTS AND COMMENTS

County Counsel Joe Bell said in terms of litigation things were quiet due to the court holiday, but he had ongoing dialog with the County Administrator on other matters.

County Engineer Bill Gleba reported a spate of water main breaks, likely due to temperature fluctuations, occurring in Washington Township, Belvidere, and a significant portion of Alpha Borough. County Route 642 was currently closed, but was expected to reopen within two days. "We are trying to get these repairs done as quickly as we can with the utilities that are involved," he said.

County Planner Dave Dech was pleased to announce the completion of a bridge along the Morris Canal for hiking and biking. The 60-foot-long bridge spans a large dip in the mostly level towpath trail where a stream breaches the canal route. This allowed hikers and cyclists to have an uninterrupted jaunt of about two miles through the woods from Bilby Road in Hackettstown to Waterloo Road (County Route 604) at Saxton Falls in Allamuchy. Mr. Dech said it was a great team effort, involving the county's Bridge Division, Road Division, Land Preservation Department personnel, and state parks. He thanked them all, and said the Bridge Division did a fantastic job installing the bridge.

County CFO Kim Francisco said he and Mr. Lazorisak had met with several department heads this week regarding budget request details, and would have updated numbers prepared for the January 16 budget meeting.

After presenting the latest vacancy report for approval, County Administrator Alex Lazorisak said today was day number 308 since the formation of the COVID-19 task force. Earlier in the day, the governor announced opening up vaccine eligibility to

individuals age 65 and older, and age 16 and up with certain medical conditions. "The phones have been ringing all day," he said, but all vaccination appointments were filled into next week. The county received 40 positive responses so far from medical professionals, volunteering to help administer the vaccine as we endeavor to open up our second and third vaccination sites. Pending was a site in north warren and one in the Southwest Library branch. Mr. Lazorisak said the big question whether the county would receive vaccine supply from the state as promised.

County Health Officer Pete Summers reported on the latest COVID numbers, with more than 4,580 total cases in the county reported to date, averaging about 60 cases per day. The State of New Jersey was averaging about 72 cases per 100,000 of population, and there was no county in the state with less than 52 cases per 100,000. "So there's a lot of COVID-19 spreading around Warren County and the state as a whole," said Mr. Summers.

Data from Warren County hospitals showed they were holding steady, with about 68 percent of ventilators available and 15 percent of ICU beds open, and there wasn't much ICU space in Warren County to begin with. Mr. Summers said there was about 34 percent ICU availability in the northwest part of our state, and 44 percent statewide. He thought this was an important consideration for the governor as he determined what should be open and closed throughout the state.

Regarding vaccination, Mr. Summers reiterated the new eligibility guidelines from the state (everyone over the age of 65, and ages 16-64 with certain medical conditions). An important point was that to date, Warren County had only the Moderna vaccine, which was only approved for ages 18 and older. The Pfizer vaccine was approved for ages 16 and older. He was awaiting information on how much vaccine the county could expect the following week, and hoped to be able to add some vaccination dates to our calendar. "I know a lot of people are waiting, I just ask for folks to be patient," Mr. Summers said. Another important detail was that the County of Warren was not utilizing the state's appointment scheduling system at this time. Anyone seeking to be vaccinated in Warren County would have to use the scheduling system on the official Warren County government website.

COUNTY COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Lori Ciesla noted this was her first official regular meeting, but had been working on budget matters all month. She wanted to give a "shout out" to the CFO, department heads and County Administrator for doing a great job on budget proposals and staying within parameters "to keep our county affordable and do everything we need to do for this pandemic," she said. Ms. Ciesla also expressed appreciation to the Health Department, and all the medical professionals who volunteered to help with vaccinations. Ms. Ciesla was proud to point out that this meeting was accessible online, with everyone on the dais having laptops in front of them. She appreciated all the hard work everyone was doing.

Commissioner Jason Sarnoski said the laptops were "the new norm" as the board was trying to be responsive to the public. He said growing pains, as we were experiencing this evening, were to be expected. He predicted things would improve as we move forward and continue to interact with the public electronically through this pandemic. Regarding the budget, he said this was a tough year, but he was confident we would get through with the help of the CFO and Administrator, and do some positive things for the county.

Commissioner James Kern also remarked on the "new, uncharted territory for us" with respect to the virtual meeting, but thought they were off to a good start.

Following up on a goal he had mentioned at the board's reorganization meeting, Mr. Kern said he had begun working with the County Planner to institute regional planning meetings, starting with the southern municipalities (Alpha, Franklin, Greenwich, Pohatcong, Lopatcong and Phillipsburg). He said they were looking forward to this initiative.

With respect to the volunteers and the vaccine, he thanked the County Administrator; Deputy Public Safety Director, Dennis Riley; and Pete Summers for their quick action. He thought 40 doctors, nurses and medical professionals in Warren County stepping up to help vaccinate was a testament to our county – a sense of community pride and willingness to work together.

As he had mentioned at the beginning of the meeting, Mr. Kern said, "Our country is really facing some difficult times, and I think we should all pray for our leaders, and I think the residents of Warren County know that you have a government that will be working for you, no matter our politics."

CLOSING PUBLIC COMMENTS

Theresa Chapman of Harmony said she appreciated the WebEx meeting platform; it was an improvement. She read a statement saying the events of last week demonstrated that the words of our elected officials truly matter. Ms. Chapman urged the commissioners to adopt a resolution condemning the violent insurrection that

occurred on January 6. She said there were currently more than 15,000 troops deployed ready to defend our capitol. "Our U.S. troops are deployed to defend our country against Americans," she said, and repeated it for emphasis. She said our children were watching our local leaders, and they needed to act. "We need to condemn this so this never happens again," she said.

Ian Watts of Washington Borough read a model resolution that he encouraged local, state and federal officials to consider, strongly condemning the insurrection in Washington, D.C. on January 6, 2021 and in support of a peaceful transfer of power to President-elect Joseph Biden.

Mark Daly of Hackettstown voiced support of the draft resolution Mr. Watts proposed. He said we were at risk, and many felt insecure about the future of our democracy. He thought this was important for the future of our children and grandchildren, to do the right thing when called upon. He suggested the commissioners pass the resolution.

Edward Grimes spoke of being wheelchair-bound, having had many surgeries, and suffering from chronic pain. He talked about Oxycodone and having to jump through hoops to obtain opiates, and that it was easier to get heroin. He said there was supposed to be no stigma, but there was a huge stigma. He seemed to be under the impression that the Board of Chosen Freeholders had passed a resolution opposing medical marijuana, and he was advocating for access to cannabis for pain management.

As the only current board member who was a freeholder when the marijuana resolution was passed, Mr. Sarnoski jumped and corrected the gentleman, informing him that resolution opposed recreational use of marijuana at a time when the state legislature was considering legalizing it without a voter referendum. It did not oppose medical marijuana.

Mr. Grimes pressed on, asking if the commissioners protected his constitutional eight to grow his cannabis. Mr. Kern said he had disagreed with the opposing resolution two years ago when passed by a prior board. Mr. Sarnoski said recreational use had since been approved by the voters, and he abides by laws whether he agreed with them or not.

There were no questions or comments from the press.
